Dear Parents, Caregivers and Community Members

Once again, I'd like to thank all members of our school community for their ongoing support of the School during COVID-19 restrictions. I will advise adjustments which will probably commence Term Three, once we've been given the documentation. This will be sent out via emails, our Connected App and also uploaded to our Facebook and webpage. Please be patient as we wait for advice from CEWA and the WA Government.

Sacraments: Congratulations to our Year Three students who received the sacrament of Reconciliation on 11 June 2020. We are waiting to be advised from the Bishop as to when our students can celebrate the sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation. We have a tentative date for Confirmation, Sunday 29 November at 10am Mass and will verify this as soon as possible.

Winter Uniforms continue in Term Three, which includes black leather shoes whilst wearing the formal uniform. Girls wearing the formal winter uniform are to have navy blue short socks or navy blue tights. Students up to and including Year Two continue to wear their sports uniforms. All shoulder length hair or longer is required to be tied up with either royal blue, yellow, black or white colours. Headbands, ribbon or elastics need to reflect the School colours. Faction coloured scrunchies etc may be worn on faction carnival days. Extreme hairstyles such as dyed or coloured hair and shaved patterned hair designs are not permitted. Special days such as Wacky Hair Day, Faction Carnivals are exempt. Parents must ensure the hair design can be reverted to normal the next day.

Jewellery is not part of the school uniform, however, children who have pierced ears are to wear plain gold or silver studs or sleepers (one earring in each earlobe). Watches and simple chains with emblems of religious significance may be worn, however, the School takes no responsibility for their loss or damage. Make up or nail polish is not permitted.

Reports will be sent home tomorrow on the last day of this term, Wednesday 1 July 2020. Please take the time to discuss these with your child/ren during the break and if you have any questions, please contact the office to arrange either a phone meeting, or, if the world allows it, a face-to-face meeting with your child/ren's class teacher.

Cross Country will be held on school grounds on the first Friday of Term Three, 24 July, notes have been sent out. If we are allowed to attend the Interschool Cross Country, this will be in the second week of term. We will advise families as soon as we can.

School photos are taking place on Wednesday 26 August. Forms explaining the ordering option will be sent home tomorrow.
