A kind reminder about Canteen Orders

We understand that mornings can be busy and unpredictable and that sometimes things don't go quite to plan. However, we've recently had a number of children arrive at school without food and without a lunch order, which has left them feeling understandably upset and anxious.

If you've told your child that you'll be ordering from the canteen, we kindly ask that you please ensure the order is placed before the cut-off time of 8:30am. This small step makes a big difference in helping your

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child feel secure and cared for throughout their school day. We know that everyone is doing their best and we truly appreciate your support in helping us make sure every student is well-fed, happy and ready to learn.

Crisis Management

Schools are obliged to plan for the safety of all individuals attending our site. Therefore, the school has a duty of care to ensure that all school related activities are conducted safely. In the emergency management context, the duty of care requires that pre-planning be undertaken for emergencies that might affect the school from time to time. As Principal, it is my responsibility for managing school related emergencies and critical incidents. The school has developed a Crisis Management Plan (CMP) which details how the school prepares for, responds to and recovers from emergency events. This plan outlines the responsibilities, drills and procedures that need to be used during emergency simulation activities. For example, depending on the context of the emergency, a decision will be made to deal with the matter internally, seek external assistance (fire, police, ambulance), evacuate the school, shelter-in-place or lockdown. The school regularly schedules training, drills and simulations to support the effectiveness of the CMP. Feel confident that the school is able to respond to an incident that affects the safety and/or wellbeing of your children.

Code of Conduct

As outlined in previous newsletters, I'll be sharing simple summaries of each of the 12 Code of Conduct statements to help us all better understand and uphold these shared expectations.

Statement Four-You conduct yourself in accordance with laws, agreements, policies and standards relevant to your relationship with the school community.

As a valued member of our school community-whether as a parent, staff member, visitor or School Advisory Council member-your relationship with the school is guided by the relevant agreement or role you hold.

We all share a responsibility to act respectfully, safely, and in line with school policies. If you witness unsafe or inappropriate behaviour, it's important to report it to the Principal or appropriate authority. If concerns are not addressed, further action may be taken through external channels. Everyone is expected to

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respect others and school property, and to use school resources responsibly. Thank you for helping us maintain a safe, respectful, and supportive environment for all.

As we move through the term, I want to express my deep gratitude for the continued support, trust and partnership of our families. Together, we are building a strong, faith-filled community where every child is known, valued, and nurtured. In the words of Jean Vanier... "One of the marvellous things about community is that it enables us to welcome and help people in a way we couldn't as individuals."

Thank you for being part of our Catholic school of excellence-a place where every child is known and every family plays a vital role.
