#### **Annual Community Meeting-Save the date!**

The St Joseph's Annual Community Meeting (ACM) is scheduled for Wednesday 12 November at 5:30pm in the school Assembly Hall. A very important part of the ACM is recruiting parents and caregivers for roles on the School Advisory Council and the Parents and Friends (P&F) group. These groups are an integral part of St Joseph's and add much richness and positivity to our school community.

#### Proposed Development Application for McDonalds and Aldi-Pinjarra Town Centre

As a property owner within the Pinjarra town centre, our school has been invited to provide feedback on the proposed McDonald's and Aldi development application. In consultation with Fr Robert Romano (Parish Priest) and Mr Owen McLarty (Chair of the Catholic School Advisory Council), I have submitted a formal response on behalf of our community. While we recognise the potential economic benefits these developments may bring to the area, we have expressed significant concerns regarding traffic and pedestrian safety-particularly for our students and the elderly parishioners of St Augustine's Catholic Parish.

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Additionally, the proposed location of a fast-food outlet in close proximity to two schools raises important public health considerations. Please be assured that we remain committed to advocating for the safety and wellbeing of our school community throughout this process.

#### **Bushfire Response**

St Joseph's Catholic Primary School is situated within a high fire danger zone as determined by the Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES). As a result, the School is required to have in place an up to date Bushfire Evacuation Plan.

Inclusion on this fire danger zone means that the School may be required to invoke pre-emptive closure on any day for which a Catastrophic Fire Danger Rating (FDR) has been declared for the Shire of Murray. A Catastrophic FDR means that if a fire starts, it is likely to be uncontrollable, unpredictable, and fast moving. When given advance warning by DFES that a Catastrophic FDR has been forecast for a given day, St Joseph's Catholic Primary School would close for that day. The intention of this closure is to ensure maximum safety and minimum risk for students and staff.

Parents will be advised of the of closure, by SMS, on the day before the planned closure. Parents would be kept up to date on further developments, including the re-opening of the School by SMS.

Please contact the school if you have any questions about the Bushfire Plan or possible planned School closures during the bushfire season.
